On motion of Mr. Schley,

The House proceeded with the ordinary business of the session in the absence of the doorkeeper.

On motion of Mr. Gallagher,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to divorce Emanuel H. Michael of the city of Baltimore, from his wife Norah Michael, a vinculo matrimonii;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the

Senate.

On motion of Mr. Grove,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to divorce Sarah Mennypenny of Washington county, from her husband Samuel Mennypenny, a vinculo matrimonii;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the

Senate.

Mr. Hollman submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates, March 2nd, 1842.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We return to your honorable body the bill entitled, an act for the protection of mechanics and others, in Washington and Cecil counties, which originated in the House of Delegates, passed and sent to the Senate, and was returned on the 28th of February last, endorsed "will not pass." We pray your honorable body to reconsider and pass said bill.
