

“Be it enacted by the General Assembly of Maryland, That Emeline A. Bennet be and she is hereby divorced from her husband William H. Bennet;”

Which was read.

On the question being put,

Will the House accept the said substitute?

It was determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill;

And on being put,

It was passed and sent to the Senate.

And reported unfavorably on the petition of Jesse C. Burroughs of St. Mary's county, praying to be divorced from his wife Susan C. Burroughs;

Read the first and by special order the second time.

Mr. Causin then moved to recommit the said petition to the committee on Divorces, with instructions to report a bill to divorce the said Jesse C. Burroughs from his wife Susan C. Burroughs;

And determined in the affirmative.

The question then recurred on concurring in the said report;

Mr. Tuck, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the bill from the Senate, entitled an act to quiet possessions, confirm titles and make valid certain proceedings in Chancery, reported the same without amendment;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

The Speaker laid before the House the report of the clerk of Anne Arundel county court in relation to the attendace of judges;

Read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Tuck, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was recommitted the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to make valid the proceedings of Philip Gore as a justice of the peace and as justice of the district court of Carroll county, reported favorably thereon;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Hook reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act passed April 1st, 1839, authorizing the commissioners of Baltimore county to appoint commissioners to build a bridge over the Western Run on the Pimbllico road over the said run near the Upper Pimbllico Factory;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Tuck, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to which was referred the bill entitled, an act for the relief of Stephen Wales, a free man of color of Dorchester county, reported favorably thereon;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the Senate.
