Severally read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Leave was granted to Messrs. Spencer, Grove, Hollman and Lyday, to bring in a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Lucretia M. Pool of Washington county.

Mr. Gallagher submitted the following resolution:
Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General be, and he is hereby directed to furnish to Captain J. I. Denaker, for the use of the First Baltimore Light Infantry, sixty muskets, with the necessary accoutrements to match, on condition that the said Captain J. I. Denaker, give sufficient security for the safe keeping and return of the same to the Adjutant General.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.
