So the said bill was passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson submitted the following resolution :

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General be, and he is hereby authorised and directed to sell at public auction such damaged military arms, stores, &c., now lying in the State Gun House at Annapolis, as he may deem expedient, and that the proceeds of such sales be deposited in the Treasury of the Western Shore, subject to his official order, for the purchase of suitable harness for the brass pieces of ordnance in the use of the "Annapolis Artillerists." And also for the purpose of repairing and fitting up said gun house as an armory for the uniformed volunteer companies of Annapolis.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.
