The bill entitled, an act to establish primary schools in the upper election district of Caroline county ;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment."

Amendment proposed :

Strike out the 10th section and insert the following :

Section 10. And be it enacted, That if this act shall be confirmed by the voters of the said upper election district, the Orphans court of said county, shall forthwith appoint three commissioners, whose duty it shall be to define the limits of the different school districts of the upper election district of said county, which have not been heretofore defined, and report the result of their labours to said Orphans court, at the earliest day practicable, and said report shall be considered binding upon the said school districts, and the trustees of the several schools shall be regulated by the limits of their several districts, as defined by the said commissioners ; and said Orphans court shall pay to said commissioners two dollars each per day, out of the school fund of said upper district, for the time they may be employed in performing the duties enjoined upon them by this act.

Sec. 11. And be it enacted, That it shall be the duty of the clerks of the election of the upper election district, to keep a separate list of the votes cast by the voters of school district No. 3, of said election district ; and if a majority of the votes cast by the voters of said school district No. 3, shall be given against
