this act, then the law of eighteen hundred and forty, establishing a free school in said district, shall be repealed, and said school shall afterwards be governed by the same laws which regulated said school before the passage of the aforesaid act of eighteen hundred and forty, otherwise said law shall continue in full force and effect.

Which was read and assented to, and

Ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, an act to provide for the inspection of Lumber at Havre de Grace;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments."

Amendments proposed:

Strike out all after the enacting clause and insert:

"That from and after the passage of this act, the Governor shall, with the advice and consent of the Senate, appoint two inspectors of lumber for the town of Havre de Grace, said inspectors to have the power to appoint one deputy each.

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That the said inspectors shall inspect all lumber arriving at Havre de Grace, and intended for the

consumption of Harford county.

- Sec. 3. And be it enacted, That lumber arriving at Havre de Grace, intended for reshipment or exportation shall not be inspected, unless required so to be, by the owner or owners thereof.
- Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That the inspectors of lumber at Port Deposit, Cecil county, shall not be authorized to inspect lumber within the limits of Harford county, and they are hereby subjected to the fine of five dollars for each piece of timber or lumber which they may hereafter inspect in last mentioned county, said fine to be recovered before a justice of the peace of Harford county, as small debts are now recovered, one half to the informer and the other half to the State.
- Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That the inspectors of lumber appointed under this act, shall be governed by the provisions of the act of December session 1811, chapter 70, and the 3rd and 4th sections of the act of December session 1817, chapter 141.
- Sec. 6. And be it enacted, That the said inspectors shall be entitled to receive, as a compensation for inspecting all boards, plank and scantling, at the rate of thirty cents for every thousand feet, board measure; and for inspecting all shingles they shall be entitled to receive twenty cents for each and every thousand, the one half to be paid by the buyer and the other half by the seller."

Which were read and assented to, And the bill ordered to be engrossed.

And the bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, a supplement to an act passed December session 1836, chapter 230, for primary schools in Frederick county;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment."
