The following amendment was read and assented to:

Insert after the first section the following, as an additional section:

Section 2. And be it enacted, That any holder of said checks or orders, (other than the collectors or their deputies or agents,) upon the presentation of the same to the Treasurer of the Western Shore, shall receive therefor an equal sum in specie or its equivalent, and the said treasurer is hereby authorized and instructed to redeem as aforesaid, any such check or order made upon him in compliance with the provisions of this act, provided however, that the treasurer shall not be required to redeem said orders, until after the expiration of the time at which the loan by the banks issuing the same would be payable according to the terms of its loan.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill as amended,
