Darby.

Mr. Risteau from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the relief of Elijah Taylor of Baltimore county, reported the same wihout amendment;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to

the Senate.

Mr. Sutton of Kent from the select committee to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the relief of the heirs at law of Emory Edwards, late of Kent county, deceased, reported the same without amendment;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to

the Senate.

Mr. Spencer reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Lucretia M. Post of Washington county;

Read the first time and laid on the table.

Mr. Spencer submitted the following message:

By the House of Delegates,

March 4th, 1842.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We respectfully decline concurring in your resolution appointing agents to represent the State in the joint stock companies in which the State is interested. As this is a very important matter, and being anxious to make such nominations an will in our opinion be acceptable to both Houses, we propose a committee of conference on that subject, and have appointed Messrs. Carmichael, Spencer and Causin, the committee on the part of this House.
