quired to obtain copies of the several opinions delivered by the judges of the Supreme Court of the United States in the case of Prigg vs. The Commonwealth of Pennsylvania, and to cause said copies to be printed in pamphlet form, and to forward one copy thereof to each member of the Legislature—one copy to each of the clerks and registers of wills of the several counties and Baltimore city court and of Howard district, and the treasurer is hereby authorized to pay the expense attending the execution of this resolution upon the requisition of the Governor.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

Owens of Anne Arundel, Sellman, Dorsey and Hammond, to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act regulating the manner of levying on the assessable property in Anne Arundel county, for the support of primary schools in said county, passed December 1830, chapter 97.

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to

the Senate.

Mr. Sellman reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid a certain instrument of writing therein mentioned;

sent to the Senate.

Mr. Johnson reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Charles Oliver of the city of Baltimore;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Owens of Anne Arundel,

The bill entitled, an act to preserve the breed of fish in the waters of the Chesapeake Bay and for other purposes;
