Mr. Presstman made the following report:

The committee appointed on the part of this House to meet in conference with a similar committee appointed on the part of the Senate, in relation to the subject of specie payments by the banks, respectfully

REPORT:

That a majority of said committee of conference have agreed to introduce a bill providing for a resumption of specie payments by the banks of this State on the first day of May next; to allow said banks to issue until the first day of January 1843, notes of a less denomination than five dollars to an amount equal to one fifth of their several capitals; and also, to provide for proceedings by scire facias, in case of a continued or any future suspension of specie payments by the said banks.

To this conclusion of the conference the undersigned dissent, preferring to adhere to the bill as passed by this House on the 25th of January of the present session.
