The House took up the bill entitled, an act to authorize the laying out and opening a road through a part of Frederick and Montgomery counties;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Maccubbin reported a bill entitled, an act to establish a public road in Prince George's county;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Owens of Anne Arundel submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the State Librarian be authorized and required to send one copy of Dorsey's Compilation of the Laws of Maryland, and one copy of Dorsey's Testamentary Laws of Maryland to the Executive of each State and Territory in the United States;

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to authorize Giles Hicks of Caroline county to pay over certain money in his hands as trustee for the sale of the real estate of Philemon Plummer, late of Caroline county, deceased;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Hook,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to divorce Eleanor Welsh of Baltimore city from her husband John Welsh, a vinculo matrimonii;

Read the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Shaw submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore pay to John M. Buchanan, for the use of John T. Edwards, sixty-five dollars, it being the amount allowed by the General Assembly of this State by resolution number thirty-one, passed on the 3rd day of March 1842, to said John T. Edwards, for provisions furnished by the said Edwards to troops.
