

with forty-five muskets and accoutrements to match, on his giving bond for the safe keeping and return of the same.

Which was read, assented to and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Sutton of Harford presented the petition of sundry citizens of Harford county, praying further time to allow David Silver, former collector of said county, to complete his collections ;

Read and referred to Messrs. Sutton of Harford, Johns, Bouldin and Hope.

Mr. Simmons, chairman of the committee on the Militia, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to enrol, organize, equip and regulate the militia of this State, passed at December session 1834, ch. 251, reported the same without amendment ;

Read the second time by special order, passed and returned to the Senate.

On motion of Mr. Geyer,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act relating to charges for transportation on the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road ;

Read the second time by special order.

Mr. Schley then moved to amend said bill by adding as an additional section the following :

And be it enacted, That the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company, shall not hereafter charge for the transportation of shorts, shipstuff and bran, more than they were allowed before the passage of the late law, in regard to charges on the road ;

Which was read ;

On the question being put,

Will the House assent to the said amendment ?

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill ;

And on being put,
