And a bill entitled, an act for the relief of the securities of Israel Mayberry, late collector of the taxes of Allegany county;

Read the first time, and

Referred to Messrs. Shaw, Buskirk and Buchanan.

And returned the resolution relating to newspapers and postage;

Endorsed "assented to."

Ordered to be engrossed.

And returned the following bills:

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act for the speedy recovery of small debts out of court, and to repeal the acts of Assembly therein mentioned;

Endorsed "will not pass."

The bill entitled, a further supplement to the act enlarging the powers of the High Court of Chancery;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment."

Amendment proposed:

Strike out the first and second sections of the bill after the enacting clause, and also the words "be it enacted" in the third section;

Read and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Sarah Henrietta Mayo
of Anne Arundel county;

The bill entitled, an act for the establishment of a public landing and wharf at Green Landing in Prince George's county;

The bill entitled, an act in relation to the Maryland Peniten-

tiary;

The bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to authorize the banks of the State of Maryland to receive and pay out the orders drawn by the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Company on the stock of the city of Baltimore, and for other purposes;

Severally endorsed "will pass." Severally ordered to be engrossed.

And the bill entitled, an act to alter and amend the constitution and form of government so as to provide for the election of county clerks and registers of wills immediately by the people;

Endorsed "will not pass."

The House then took up the bill entitled, an act to levy a tax on dogs in this State;

Read the second time and rejected.

Mr. Tuck presented a communication from D. McCurdy in relation to his new system for teaching Geometry;

Read and referred to the committee on Education.

On motion of Mr. Carmichael,

Leave was granted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to amend and reduce into system the law to direct descents passed at December session 1820, ch. 91.
