

to charge reasonable wharfage for vessels lying at the same; provided, that this act shall not authorize said commissioners to extend any street or build any wharf to the prejudice or injury of any individual without making compensation for such injury; and provided also, that where any one is aggrieved by the decision of said commissioners in fixing the line or point of high water mark, such person may appeal at any time within one year to the county court, and have said decision received and corrected by said court, and the said court may hear testimony in such appeal."

Read and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
