“And be it enacted, That from and after the time when this act shall have gone into effect, no bank within this State that may issue notes under the sum of five dollars, and not less than one dollar, as hereinbefore provided, shall be authorized to issue or pay out any such note other than its own, unless otherwise requested by the holder of any check, note or other demand against said bank; and upon non-compliance with the provision of this section, the person aggrieved, upon proper protest, may enter suit before any magistrate, and be entitled to recover double the amount of the sum sued for, with costs of such suit.”

Which was read.

Before the question was put on the said amendment,

Mr. Owens of Anne Arundel moved to amend the 1st section of said bill by adding thereto the following:

“Which said notes or certificates of deposit shall be redeemed in specie on demand.”

On the question being put,

Will the House assent to the said amendment?
