an act to confirm the titles of purchasers in the cases therein referred to, reported the same with the following amendment:

"And be it enacted, That nothing contained in this act shall be so construed as to cause any other defect in the proceedings under existing laws relating to insolvents, then the failure to give bond with security by any permanent trustee, or the want of ratification by the court of any sale made by such trustee."

Which was read and assented to, and the bill

Read the second time by special order.

The question being on the passage of said bill;

Mr. Sutton of Harford moved the previous question, and the same being demanded by a majority of the members present;

The main question was then put,

Shall the said bill pass?
