The bill entitled, an act to divorce Albert G. Miller of Kent county, from his wife Margaret Ann Miller, a mensa et thoro;

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Elizabeth Collins of the city of Baltimore, from her husband William S. Collins, a vinculo matrimonii;

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Mary Ellen Vogel of the city of Baltimore, from her husband Zachariah Vogel, a vinculo matrimonii;

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of Sarah E. Mithell;

The bill entitled, a supplement to an act for the benefit of the children of James Power of the city of Baltimore, passed December session 1839, ch. 181;

The bill entitled, an act to divorce Mary Parsons of Baltimore county, from her husband Edward Parsons, a vinculo matrimonii;

The bill entitled, a further additional supplement to an act entitled, an act for the distribution of school monies and the encouragement of schools and teachers in Harford county;

The bill entitled, an act to levy a tax on certain articles therein mentioned;

The bill entitled, an act for the relief of William H. Fitzhugh, former collector of Washington county;
