

Sec. 2. And be it enacted, That so much of the said original act to which this act is a supplement, as gives exclusive jurisdiction to the said district courts in the cases in said act mentioned, be and the same is hereby repealed, and it is hereby declared that the county court of Carroll county shall have concurrent jurisdiction with the said district courts in all cases in which the said district courts now have jurisdiction.

Read and assented to.

The bill entitled, an act to regulate the compensation of jurors and witnesses in Worcester county, endorsed "will pass."

The bill entitled, an act relating to schools in the middle and lower election districts of Caroline county;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendment;"

Insert as the 5th section,

"And be it enacted, That the third and fourth sections of this act shall be inoperative unless the said trustees of school No. 6, shall cause the school house in said district No. 6, to be erected within the present year;"

Read and assented to.

And the bill entitled, an act to extend the time for completing the collections of Henry L. Coombs, late collector of Prince George's county;

Endorsed "will pass."

And delivered a bill entitled, an act for the promotion of education in Somerset county;

Read the first and by special order the second time, passed and returned to the Senate.

Tabular pages double the above prices.

Index to the House journal, \$150.
