where liberal hands effuse envied treasures, and the sunny wings

of innocence and love protect the scene.

Go then, to receive the warm salutations of friends, and the welcome plaudits of a confiding constituency; whose interest you have been endeavoring to promote; and may happiness attend you.

And in conclusion permit me to say, that if there be in our language, one word which is full of meaning, which arouses the nobler feelings of the heart, and which is fully calculated to impress a deep sensation, it is the word "farewell." The poet has truly said,

Pen cannot paint, tongue cannot tell,

The keen sensations of the word farewell.

With sentiments of the purest esteem and respect, with feelings that I cannot find language sufficiently strong to express, I now bid you, farewell.

Mr. Randall submitted the following resolution:

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Adjutant General be required to furnish Captain William H. Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore be, and he is hereby directed to pay out of any unappropriated money in the treasury, to John Nick. Watkins, chief clerk of the House of Delegates, and to Joseph H. Nicholson, chief clerk of the Senate, the sum of one hundred dollars each; to Peter Webb, assistant clerk of the House of Delegates, and to John N. Watkins, assistant clerk of the Senate, the sum of one hundred dollars each; and to Marcy Fountain, John B. Henderson, V. H. Kalkman, Tillotson Janney, John P. Milton and H. R. Bowie, committee clerks to the House of Delegates, the sum of fifty dollars each; and to James C. Reyner and John N. Gordon, committee clerks to the Senate, the sum of fifty dollars each.
