On motion of Mr. Graves,

The House took up the bill entitled, an act to levy a tax upon incomes arising from ground rents;

Read the second time by special order, passed and sent to the

Senate.

And the bill entitled, an act to define the powers of those persons holding licenses to sell tickets;

Read the second time.

Mr. Presstman moved to reject the said bill;

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred on the passage of the said bill;

And on being put,

It was passed and sent to the Senate.

The clerk of the Senate delivered the following message:

By the Senate,

March 10th, 1842.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:
