By the House of Delegates, March 10th, 1842.

Gentlemen of the Senate:

We return you the bill entitled, an act to complete the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal to Cumberland, and for other purposes, and respectfully request you to recede from your adherence to your second and third amendments, in order that the difference between the Houses may be adjusted by a conference.
