

TARIFF—Ordered, that so much of the Governor's message as relates to the, be referred to a select committee of five 24; committee on, appointed *ib.*

Resolutions of the Legislatures of Connecticut, Rhode Island and Massachusetts, in relation to the, referred to the committee on the, 42.

TAX—Leave for a bill to repeal the act passed the 1st of April 1841, entitled, an act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a, to pay the debts of the State 29; proceedings on and leave referred 30.

Order to the committee on ways and means, to inquire into the expediency of laying a, upon all bills discounted by banking institutions, also of laying a, upon all brokers and dealers in exchange, adopted 39.

Leave for a bill supplemental to the act for the general valuation and assessment of real and personal property in this State, and to provide a, to pay the debts of the State, to enable the collectors of said, to retain their commission out of the money they may collect under said law 40; bill reported and ordered to be printed 194; taken up an amended 241; an amendment rejected and vote thereon 242; passed as amended and sent to the senate 243; returned passed 312.

Leave granted for a bill to amend the 61st section of an act, for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a, to pay the debts of the State 52.

Committee on ways and means instructed to inquire into the propriety of imposing a graduated, upon all income, other than that taxed by the act of 1840, ch. 23, also a, upon all theatres, museums, races, public concerts and balls or masquerades, on all travelling caravans, jugglers and practices of legerdemain, and upon all public exhibitions, the object of which is income, as also to inquire into the propriety of increasing the price now paid for licenses to auctioneers, brokers, lottery dealers, hawkers and pedlars, traders, billiard tables and keepers of ordinaries, also the per centum now paid upon goods sold at auction, and also the imposing a, on license on commission merchants, &c. 52.

Leave for a bill to provide for the more ready collection of the, in Prince George's county, by the division of said county in collection districts 68; bill reported and laid on the table 196; taken up, passed and sent to the senate 228; returned passed 311.
