On motion of Mr. Causin, at 19711 92011

Said vote was reconsidered and the said bill with the amendments referred to the said committee.

Mr. Buchanan submitted the following resolution:

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Topographical Engineer and the Geologist of the State, be and they are hereby requested, to deposite with the Executive of this State, all such Mineralogical Collections, as they have obtained in the prosecution of their duties as Topographical Engineer and Geologist aforesaid.

Which was read the first time and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Graves,

The house took up the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled an act to direct the manner in which the agents to represent the State in all joint stock companies in which the State has an interest shall hereafter be appointed—being the order of the day;

On motion of Mr. Causin,

Said bill was made the special order of the day for Friday week. Mr. Hollman, chairman of the committee on Claims, submitted

the following:

It being represented and shewn to this General Assembly, that Esther Henry, an Indian Annuitant of Maryland, died intestate in the year eighteen hundred and twenty-eight, leaving three sons living at the time of her death, her only descendants and heirs at law, viz:—Thomas Henry, James Henry and Washington Henry —of whom the said Thomas and Washington have since died intestate and without issue, and the said James Henry has also since died intestate, leaving Ellen Henry his only child and heir at law, now residing in Baltimore and yet under the age of twenty-one years—who is considered entitled to one third of the annuity of her Grand Mother.

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the Treasurer of the Western Shore, be and he is hereby directed to pay to Joseph Ennalls of Dorchester county, for the use of the said Ellen Henry, the sum of one hundred and forty dollars-being the arrears of so much of said annuity, from the 1st January 1828 to the 1st January 1842.

Read the first time and laid on the table.

On motion of Mr. Sellman, The house took up the bill entitled, an act to confirm an act to alter and amend the Constitution of this State;

Read the second time by special order and will pass. Mr. Geyer moved that the house do now adjourn;

Determined in the negative.

On motion of Mr. Hollman, The house took up for consideration the resolution in favor of Joseph Ennalls for the use of Ellen Henry;
Read the second time by special order and assented to.
