

A report from the clerk of St. Mary's county court, relative to monies paid by him into the treasury of the State, within the year ending on 30th, of November;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Ways and Means; also

A report from the clerk of St. Mary's county court, relative to the attendance of judges;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Freeman presented the memorial of W. Morton, of George Town, District Columbia, detailing the circumstances attending the loss of tobacco by him in consequence of some neglect or otherwise of the State inspectors, and asking an investigation into the affair, and compensation for his loss;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Inspections.

The Speaker presented the memorial of the Baltimore and Harford turpike road company, by John S. Gittings President thereof;

Which was read.

Mr. Yellott moved to refer said memorial to the select committee appointed on that subject.

Mr. Carroll moved to refer said memorial to a select committee to be composed of two members from the counties of Baltimore, Harford and Baltimore city;

Resolved in the affirmative.

In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messrs. Carroll, Poutney, Carey, Curley, Yellott and Polk, the committee.

Mr. Carey presented the memorial of the Baltimore Water company, for a supplement to their charter;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Carey, Curley, Levinger and Stansbury, of Baltimore city.

Mr. Calvert presented the petition of sundry citizens of Prince George's county, praying for certain alterations in the law, directing the manner in which officers fees shall be collected;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Boteler presented the petition of sundry citizens of the Clear Spring district, of Washington county, praying for the passage of a law, to elect constables for said district, by the people;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Boteler, Mann, Weber, Wade and Hollman.

Mr. Mann presented the petition of Christian Schafer, now in the jail of Washington county, praying the passage of an act for his release;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.
