And the bill entitled, an act incorporating the Evangelical Lutheran Synod of the State of Maryland, were severally taken up

for consideration;

Read the second time and severally passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations entitled, an act to incorporate the town of New Windsor, in Carroll county, was taken up for consideration,

Read the second time and passed.

The bill reported by Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations entitled, an act to incorporate the Barrellsville Mining Company, was taken up for consideration;

On motion of Mr. Poultney,

Said bill was ordered to lie on the table.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to provide for the distribution of that part of the school fund, which is appropriated to Baltimore county;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to fix the place of holding elections

in the fourth election district in Montgomery county

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

And, delivered the following message:
