Also, the bill entitled an act to lay out and open a road in Prince

George's county;

And the bill entitled, an act to allow Henry Harding, of Montgomery county, late sheriff and collector, further time to complete his collections;

Were sent to the Senate.

Mr. Smith presented the memorial of James H. Hoblitzell, Levi Taylor, Aden Clary, Meshech Frost and others, citizens of Allegany county, praying the passage of a law to give jurisdiction to magistrates in cases of attachments in small sums, in the county of Allegany; and

Mr. Hollman presented the petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying for the passage of an act authorising justices of the peace, to take and enter up judgements by confession

to any amount whatsoever;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on

Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Hollyday presented the petition of Pere Chambers, a free negro, of Kent county, praying for relief therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Po-

pulation.

On motion of Mr. Shriver.

Leave was granted Messrs. Shriver, Lynch, Thomas, of Frederick, Naill and Buckey, to bring in a bill, to incorporate the Frederick Literary Association.

On motion of Mr. Thomas, of Anne Arundel,

Leave was granted Messrs. Thomas, of Anne Arundel, Ligon and Warfield, to bring in a bill relating to repairs of public roads in Howard District.

On motion of Mr. Warfield,

Ordered, That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the House, the petition of sundry citizens of Howard District, relative to the size of corn barrels.

On motion of Mr. Welsh,

Leave was granted Messrs. Welsh, Poultney, Walker, Carroll and Stansbury, of Baltimore county, to bring in a bill to confirm the proceedings and extend the time of William C. Gent, David Carlisle and Samuel Stone, commissioners appointed to lay out and open a road therein mentioned, in Baltimore county.

Mr Carey reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the President and Directors of

the Baltimore Water Company;

Which was read the first and by special order the second time; Mr. Calvert moved that said bill be referred to the committee on Corporations;
