WEDNESDAY, January 17th, 1844.

The House met. Present at the call of the roll the following members:

The journal of yesterday was read.

And presented a memorial of Samuel Stump and one hundred and thirty-six other citizens, for increasing the pay of jurors on the city docket of Baltimore county court:

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on

Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Harris presented a report of the trustees of West Nottingham Academy, in Cecil county; and

Mr. Ecker presented the report of the trustees of the Freedom

Academy, in Carroll county;

Which were severally read and referred to the committee on Education.

Mr. Hammill presented the petition of Aza Jacob, and one hundred and sixty-four other citizens, farmers, mechanics, and laborers in Allegany county, praying an immediate extension of the canal to the mouth of Savage;
