Also, the bill entitled, an act to appoint commissioners in Cecil county, to lay out and open a road in said county;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to lay out and establish a road in

Prince George's county;

Severally endorsed, "will not pass."

And delivered a bill originated in and passed by the Senate, entled, an act relating to surveys in Queen Anne's county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Harrison, Earickson

and Temples.

Also, the following message:

By the Senate, January 18th, 1844.

Gentlemen of the House of Delegates:

We have considered the bill from your honorable body entitled, "an act to lay out and establish a road in Prince George's county," and we find the power to lay out roads in that county, has been conferred upon the county court, by the act of 1818, chapter 89, to which jurisdiction the Senate by its rules are constrained to refer all subjects of this character.

For reasons the force of which must be very apparent, the Senate have adopted as an inflexible rule to guide their proceedings, that they will pass no private act to give relief where the established tribunals of the State, have full jurisdiction, and can apply the proper remedy in the case presented for the action of

his branch of the legislature.

The bill therefore, for the reasons stated is rejected.
