

On motion of Mr. Kilgour,

Leave was granted Messrs. Kilgour, Griffith, Trundle and Waters, of Montgomery, to bring in a bill to make valid the official acts of certain magistrates in Montgomery county.

On motion of Mr. Smith,

Leave was granted the committee on Retrenchment, to bring in a bill to regulate the itinerant charges of members of the General Assembly of Maryland, and the officers thereof.

On motion of Mr. Allnut,

Ordered, That the committee on Inspections, be instructed to inquire into the expediency of reporting a bill to regulate the sale of wheat by the running bushel, instead of weight.

Mr. Waters, of Somerset, from the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of Samuel Davis, for a law to correct certain grievances therein mentioned ;

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Yellott, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of sundry citizens, of Washington county, praying that a law may be passed authorising justices of the peace to enter up judgments on sums over one hundred dollars ;

Which was read, and

On motion of Mr. Weber,

Ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Yellott, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, made a favorable report upon the bill reported by Mr. Weber, entitled, an act to confirm the appointment of Benjamin Swingley, as the collector of State and county taxes for the year 1843, in Washington county, and to make good as the official bond of the said collector, the bond heretofore executed by him and his securities as such, and for other purposes ;

Which was read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

Mr. Lackland reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid a deed therein mentioned :

Mr. Phelps reported a bill entitled, an act to change the name of Martin Luther Purtle, to that of Martin Luther Wall, of Dorchester county, and

Mr. Polk reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company, to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre de Grace.

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time, passed and sent to the Senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations entitled, an act for the extension and renewal of the charter of the Farmers Bank of Maryland and Branches, and for other purposes ;
