Mr. Johnson chairman of the committee on Ways and Means, to which was referred the bill reported by Mr. Powder, entitled, an act to allow Benjamin Yingling, further time to complete his collections, reported the same with the following amendment.

Amendment proposed.

At the end of the bill add the following proviso,

"Provided, That nothing in this act contained, shall be so construed as to extend or alter the time within which the said Benjamin Yingling, is required to make his payments into the State Treasury;"
