thereof as an additional section the following:

"Sec. 4. And be it enacted, That from and after the passage of this act, the clerks of the several county courts of this State, and of Howard District, be and they are hereby authorised and empowered to approve bonds of injunction in all cases of injunction to stay proceedings at law, to stay waste and in all other cases where injunctions may be granted, in the same manner as the chancellor, or any judge, or county court, acting as a court of equity are now authorised by existing laws;"

Which was read.

Mr. Johnson moved also, to amend said bill by adding as a

further additional section the following:

"Sec. 5. And be it enacted, That all appeals from orders of the court of chancery, or of county courts in equity, finally ratifying sales, shall be prayed within thirty days after the passing of such orders; and shall be heard and determined at the first term of the Court of Appeals next after such appeal shall be prayed, or at the session of the Court of Appeals holding at the time of the prayer of said appeal if the transcript of the cause shall be transmitted in time to allow full hearing and determination during said session."

Said bill and amendments were recommitted to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.
