Mr. Reeder then moved that the reading be dispensed with, and

the report and bill be printed. Resolved in the affirmative.

Which amendments were severally read the first and by a special order the second time, severally assented to, and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Howard District;

Endorsed "will not pass."

Also, the resolution in favor of John C. Kelly;

And the resolution allowing further time to Alpheus B. Hinkle, to compound on a certain certificate of survey;

Severally endorsed, "assented to," and The resolutions ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered a petition, signed by fifty citizens of Cecil county, against the bill to build a bridge over Back Creek, near Chesapeake city;
