Said bill was made the order of the day for Wednesday the 7th

of February.

The preamble and resolutions submitted by Mr. Levering on the 24th instant, in relation to Indian affairs, was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Murray moved that a "committee on Federal Relations," be appointed by the Chair, and that said preamble and resolutions be referred to that committee.

Mr. Poultney moved to lay the said preamble and resolutions on the table:

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred and was put, On the motion of Mr. Murray, and

Determined in the affirmative.

In pursuance whereof, the Speaker appointed Messrs. Murray, Levering, Causin, Thomas, of Talbot, Hollyday. Weber and Hopkins, the committee.

On motion of Mr. Kilgour,

The House proceeded to consider the order of the day, being the resolution in favor of John C. Le Grand, Jas. S. Owens and J. H. T. Magruder,

Mr. Kilgour moved to amend said resolution by striking out the words "three hundred," and inserting in lieu thereof, "one hundred and fifty;
