

And the amendment offered by Mr. Kilgour, as a substitute for said bill.

Mr. Kilgour, by permission of the House, withdrew his substitute.

Mr. Stewart then offered as a substitute for said bill, a bill No. 10, of the printed file, being a bill entitled, an act so to change the Constitution and Form of Government of this State, as to change Howard District of Anne Arundel county, into a county, to be called Howard county ;

Mr. Yellott called for the previous question, and the same being demanded by a majority of the members present, the main question was then put,

“Will the House accept the substitute?”
