The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate a company to make a turnpike road from the city of Baltimore to Havre de Grace;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to repeal an act entitled, an act to lesson the expenses of Dorchester county:

Severally endorsed "will pass," and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an additional supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Patapsco Bank of Maryland;

Endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were read the first and second time, by a special order;

Mr. Murray moved that said bill and amendments be referred to the committee on Corporations.

Mr. Ligon moved that the amendments be concurred in.

Mr. Cropper moved that the House adjourn,

Determined in the negative.

The question then recurred upon the motion of Mr. Ligon, to concur in the amendments.

Mr. Calvert rose to a point of order, whether the motion to refer the bill and amendments to the committee on Corporations, had not precedence to a motion to concur.

The chair was of opinion and so decided, that the motion to concur in the amendments, took precedence to the motion of re-

Mr. Causin moved the previous question, and the same being demanded by a majority of the members present, the said previous question was then put,

"Will the House concur in the amendments?"

Resolved in the affirmative, and

The said bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an act giving concurrent jurisdiction to single justices of the peace, over cases of attachment in Allegany county;

Severally endorsed "will pass with the proposed amendments,"

Which amendments were twice read and assented to, and the bill ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the resolutions in favor of Edward Stabler, John B. Spencer and James Wingate;

And the resolution relative to publishing the laws;

Severally endorsed "assented to" and the resolutions ordered to be engrossed.

And delivered the following bills originated in and passed by the Senate, viz:

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of the infant children of Rasin M. Gale, late of Kent county, deceased;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.
