Mr. McKaig, obtained leave to introduce a bill for the relief of John Stoyer, and Joseph Dilly, of Allegany County.

Ordered, That Messrs. McKaig, Smith, Hammill and Fitzpatrick, report the same.

Mr. Calvert, presented a letter of Dennis Humphrey, asking that the balance due him for the apprehension of James Williams may be paid;

Resolved by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the President of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of Delegates, or either of them be invested with full power to preserve proper order both within the walls of the House—the rotunda and enclosures of the State House;
