seventy-five other citizens of Harford county, praying for a law to prevent obstructions to the fish in the Chesapeake bay and its tributary streams;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appoint-

ed on that subject.

On motion of Mr. Yellott,

Leave was granted Messrs. Yellett, Polk, Hopkins and Stepenson, to bring in a bill supplementary to an act passed at December session 1842, ch. 174, relating to the Tide Water Canal;

On motion of Mr Hopkins,

Ordered. That he have leave to withdraw from the files of the House, the petition of Charles Brown, and others, of Havre de Grace.

On motion of Mr. Murray,

Leave was granted Messrs. Murray, Thomas, of Anne Arundel and Johnson, to bring in a bill to incorporate the Friendship Ly-

ceum in Anne Arundel county.

Mr. Chapman moved that the select committee appointed to visit the city of Washington, in relation to a transfer of the stock of the United States in the Chesapeake and Ohio canal to this State, be enlarged by adding thereto one member;

Resolved in the affirmative.

The Speaker thereupon appointed Mr. McKaig on said committee.

The bill entitled an act to incorporate the Hebrew Love and

Friendship Beneficial Society, of the city of Baltimore;
