

Also, the bill entitled, an act to confirm the appointment of Benjamin Swingley, as the collector of State and county taxes for the year 1843, in Washington county, and to make good as the official bond of the said collector, the bond heretofore executed by him and his securities as such and for other purposes ;

Also, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Prince George's county Agricultural society :

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills severally ordered to be engrossed.

Also, the bill entitled, an act to incorporate the trustees of Salem church, of East Harford Circuit ;

Endorsed "will not pass."

And delivered the following bills, originated in and passed by the Senate, viz :

A bill entitled, an act relating to the insolvent laws ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

A bill entitled, an act for the relief of Washington Buckey, of Frederick county ;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lynch, Shriver and Thomas, of Frederick.

A bill entitled, an act to confirm an act of the General Assembly of Virginia, entitled, an act further to amend the act incorporating the Chesapeake and Ohio canal company ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

And, a bill entitled, an act to allow Thomas Lusby, former sheriff and collector of Kent county, further time to complete his collections ;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Hollyday, Spencer and Tilden.

And the petition of sixty-seven citizens of Cecil county asking for the passage of a law to prevent the staking of gilling nets, in the head waters of the Chesapeake bay ;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appointed on that subject.

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

The House proceeded to the consideration of the order of the day, being the resolution submitted by him from the committee on Ways and Means, in relation to the sale of the coupons upon the stock of the State, standing to the credit of the sinking fund.
