The said bill was then read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Murray reported a bill entitled, an act to incorporate the Friendship Lyceum of Friendship, Anne Arundel county; and

Mr. Kilgour from the committee on Corporations, reported a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to incorporate the Town of Boonsborough, and the several additions thereto;

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the

second time, severally passed and sent to the Senate:

The rule being suspended.

Mr. Murray presented the memorial of Doctor Albert G. Welch, of Anne Arundel county, praying for a division of the second election district, in said county;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Murray, Johnson,

Ligon, Warfield and Thomas, of Anne Arundel.

Mr. Stephenson presented the petition of fifty-four citizens of Harford county, praying that the Baltimore and Harford turnpike company, be compelled to complete their road according to the terms of its charter;

Which was read and referred to the committee already appoint-

ed on that subject.

The Speaker laid before the House the report of the Abingdon

Academy;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Education. Mr. Hopkins reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to establish pilots, passed at November session 1803, ch. 63.

Which was read the first time, and

Ordered to be printed.

On motion of Mr. Ecker,

Leave was granted Messrs. Ecker, Shaw, Powder and Stull, to bring in a bill to enable Joshua C. Gist, executor of Thomas Barnes, late of Carroll county, to make and execute certain conveyances of the real estate of said deceased;

The bill reported by Mr. Stewart, from the committee on Ways and Means entitled, an act to enable William Dellinger, collector of the direct tax for Washington county, for the year 1841, and

the year 1842 in part, to complete his collections;

Was taken up for consideration.

Read the second time, passed and sent to the senate.

The bill reported by Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations entitled, an act for the extension and renewal of the charter of the Farmers Bank of Maryland and Branches, and for other purposes;

Was taken up for consideration.

Mr. Murray moved to amend said bill by adding at the end

thereof as an additional section the following:

"And be it enacted, That the names of all stockholders of the bank, with the number of shares held by each, shall be hung up in some conspicuous and convenient place in said bank, for the in-
