

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

Ordered, That leave be granted, to withdraw from the files of the House, the memorial of Mrs. Julianna Brice, of the city of Annapolis, presented at the session of 1832, to be remunerated for military services rendered by her husband, during the war of the revolution

On motion of Mr. Fitzpatrick,

Leave was granted Messrs. Fitzpatrick, Hammill, Smith and McKaig, to bring in a bill to amend an act passed at February session 1824, chapter 141, entitled, an act to disseminate literature in this State.

Mr. Dalrymple from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act to authorise William Ireland, former collector of Calvert county, further time to complete his collections, reported the same without amendment ;

The said bill was then read the first and by a special order the second time, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Potter from the select committee, to which was referred the bill from the Senate entitled, an act for the relief of the devisees of Robert Medford, reported the same without amendment ;

The said bill was then read the first and by special order second time, passed and returned to the Senate.

Mr. Yellott, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, reported a bill entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to make valid the acts of justices of the peace, relating to supersedeas, 1825, chapter 225 ;

Which was read the first time, and

Ordered to be printed.

Mr. Shriver reported a bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Catharine E. Fleming, of Frederick county ;

Which was read the first and second time by special order, and

On motion of Mr. Yellott,

Referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

On motion of Mr. Carey,

(Seconded by two other members that voted in the majority,) the House reconsidered their vote of yesterday, upon printing the report of the Commissioner of Loans, and referring the same to the committee on Ways and Means.

On motion of Mr. Carey,

Said report was referred to the joint committee of the two Houses appointed on that subject.

The House then resumed the consideration of the unfinished business of yesterday, being the bill reported by Mr. Chapman, chairman of the committee on Corporations entitled, an act for the extension and renewal of the charter of the Farmers' Bank of Maryland and Branches, and for other purposes.

Mr. Murray moved to amend said bill by adding at the end thereof, as the ninth section the following :
