Be it enacted, "That at the election for delegates to the General Assembly, for the December session of the year of our Lord eighteen hundred and forty-five, and at each succeeding election for delegates, until this act is amended or repealed, four delegates shall be elected in and for Baltimore city, four delegates in and for Baltimore county, four delegates in and for Frederick county, four delegates in and for Anne Arundel county, four delegates in and for Washington county, and three delegates in and for Allegany county, and three delegates in and for each of the several counties respectively, next hereinafter mentioned, to wit: Dorchester, Somerset, Worcester, Prince George's, Harford, Montgomery,
