

Calvert, Wooten, Semmes, Ghiselin, Earickson, Franklin, Buckey, Lynch, Thomas, of Frederick, Nail, Polk, Yellott, Hopkins, McKnett, Levering, Carey, Mann, Weber, Trundle, Kilgour, Griffith, McKaig, Smith and Ecker.—38.

So the motion was rejected.

The House then proceeded to the consideration of said bill.

Mr. Thomas, of Talbot, moved that the House resolve itself into a committee of the whole house on said bill, which motion he waived for the purpose of enabling Mr. Wooten to present the report of the Agents representing the State in Joint Stock Companies to the Legislature of Maryland, in which the report of Col. J. J. Abert on matters connected with the Chesapeake and Ohio canal company, is reviewed and answered ;

Which was read, and

On motion of Mr. Wooten,

Ordered to be printed.

The House then resumed the consideration of the order of the day, being the bill entitled a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a tax to pay the debts of the State, passed at March session 1841, chapter 23.

The question was then put,

On the motion of Mr. Thomas, of Talbot,

For the House to resolve itself into a committee of the whole House on said bill ; and

Resolved in the affirmative.

The House then resolved itself into a committee of the whole House upon the bill, (Mr. Chapman being in the Chair,) and after some time spent in committee, the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported that the said committee had in obedience to order, had said bill under consideration, and having made some progress therein, had directed him to ask leave to sit again, which leave was granted by the House.

The clerk of the Senate returned the bill entitled, an act to change the name of Bullock Town between Caroline and Queen Annes' counties, to that of Templesville ;

And the bill entitled, an act to allow Daniel Leonard, late collector of Talbot county, further time to complete his collections ;

Severally endorsed, "will pass," and the bills ordered to be engrossed.

On motion of Mr. Boteler,

The House adjourned until to-morrow morning ten o'clock.
