The bill reported by Mr. Shriver, entitled, an act to incorporate the Mutual Insurance Company of Frederick county, was taken up for consideration, and

On motion of Mr. Weber,

Referred to the committee on Corporations.

The resolution submitted by Mr. Hopewell, chairman of the committee on Pensions and Revolutionary Claims, in favor of Mary McCracken of Harford county, was taken up for consideration,

Read the second time and assented to.

The bill reported by Mr. Yellott, chairman of the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, entitled, a further supplement to an act entitled, an act to make valid the acts of justices of peace, relating to supersedeas, 1825, chapter 225, was taken up for consideration ;

Mr. Yellott offered as a substitute for said bill, a bill, entitled, an act supplementary to an act passed at December session 1825, chapter 223, relating to supersedeas by justices of the peace ;

Which was read.

On the question being put,

“Will the House accept the substitute ?”

It was resolved in the affirmative.
