to sell, shall first obtain the recommendation of two thirds of the citizens of said village;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

On motion of Mr. Yellott,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill to regulate the fees of the Attorney General and his deputies in criminal cases.

On motion of Mr. Welsh,

Ordered, That it be entered on the journal of this House, that Mr. Stansbury, of Baltimore county, is detained from his seat in consequence of the indisposition of his family.

On motion of Mr. Hollyday,

Ordered, That the committee on Colored Population, enquire into the expediency of bringing in a bill to repeal the last clause of the 7th section of the act passed March 2nd, 1837, chapter 150.

On motion of Mr. Thomas, of St. Mary's,

Leave was granted Messrs. Thomas, of St. Mary's, Hopewell and Causin, to bring in a bill entitled, a supplement to an act entitled, an act to abolish the levy court of St. Mary's county, and to provide for the election of commissioners for the said county, by the people thereof, passed at December session 1838, chapter 67.

Mr. Ligon submitted the following resolution:

Which were severally read the first, and by a special order the second time and severally concurred in

Mr. Mann chairman of the select committee, made an unfavorable report upon the petition of sundry citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of a law, authorising the commissioners of said county, to levy a sum of money to repair the court house, in said county;

Which was twice read and concurred in.

Mr. Dalrymple reported a bill entitled, an act for the relief of Benjamin J. Ireland, adm'r., of Richard E. Ireland, late sheriff and collector of Calvert county; and
