Mr. Welsh reported a bill entitled, an act to confirm an act to change the Constitution and Form of Government of this State, as to provide for the election of a sheriff in and for Baltimore county, and a sheriff in and for the city of Baltimore ;

Which was read the first time and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Kilgour reported a bill entitled, an act to make valid the official acts of Alexander Windsor, John Bonifant and Brice Latton, as justices of the peace, for Montgomery county :

Referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

The bill reported by Mr. Yellott chairman of committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, entitled, an act extending the jurisdiction of justices of the peace in Howard District of Anne Arundel county, was taken up for consideration.
