Mr. Smith presented the petition of Martin Rizer, of M., Alpheus B. Beall, Burgess Magruder, Thomas Dowden, and one hundred and fifty-six other citizens of district number six, in the county of Allegany, praying the passage of a law to regulate fences in said district;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Smith, Hammill, Fitzpatrick and McKaig.

Mr. Carey presented the petition of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, livery stable keepers, praying for a redress of grievances therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and courts of Justice.

Mr. Calvert presented the memorial of eighty-three citizens of Prince George's county, praying certain alterations in the law relating to the advertisements of sales by sheriffs and other officers;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Lankford presented the petition of one hundred and twelve citizens of Somerset county, praying a modification of the law in relation to fisheries;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lankford, Waters, of Somerset, Philips and Dennis.

Mr. Lankford presented the petition of sundry citizens of Somerset county, remonstrating against the repeal of an act of Assembly therein mentioned;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Lankford, Waters, of Somerset, Philips and Dennis.

Mr. Carey presented the petition of sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, property holders, praying the passage of an act to authorise the Mayor and City Council of Baltimore, to extend a certain street therein named:

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Carey, Curley, Stansbury, of Baltimore city and Levering.

Mr. Reeder submitted the following order,

Ordered, That the Treasurer during the recess of the Legislature, as far as practicable ascertain the amount of imports and exports of the State of Maryland, in the aggregate, and also the amount of every species of produce raised in the State, since the year 1790 annually, and report the same to the next Legislature;

Which was twice read,

Mr. Kilgour moved to amend said order by striking out "Treasurer," and inserting in lieu thereof "Secretary of State,"
