the committee on Ways and Means, entitled, a further supplement to the act entitled, an act for the general valuation and assessment of property in this State, and to provide a tax to pay the debts of the State, passed at March session 1841, chapter 23.

On motion of Mr. Johnson,

The House again resolved itself into a committee of the whole House upon said bill, (Mr. Chapman being in the Chair,) and after some time spent in committee, the Speaker resumed the Chair, and the Chairman reported that the said committe, had in obedience to order, had said bill again under consideration, and having made some progress therein, had directed him to ask leave to sit again;

Which leave was granted by the House.

On motion of Mr. Phelps,

The House adjourned until to-morrow morning 10 o'clock.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Chapman, Freeman

Mr. Chapman also presented the momorial of the citizens of Port Tobacco in Charles county, asking for an act to be passed to

Mr. Walker presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying the passage of an act to regulate division fences in said county;
