Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill, to amend the act of 1723, chapter 8, so as to authorise the clerks of the several county courts of this State, to approve injunction bonds to stay proceedings at law.

Mr. Reeder obtained leave to bring in a bill, to repeal the 8th section of the act of 1831, chapter 281, relating to the free colored

population, so far as Charles county is concerned;

Ordered, That Messrs. Reeder, Chapman and Freeman, report

the same.

Mr. Freeman obtained leave to bring in a bill, regulating fishing on the Potomac river, during certain months, and concerning obstructions to fishing on said river;

Ordered, That Messrs. Freeman, Chapman and Reeder, report

the same.

On motion of Mr. Warfield,

Leave was granted the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice, to bring in a bill, to extend the jurisdiction of justices of the peace for Howard district, and for other purposes.

Mr. Shriver obtained leave to bring in a bill, to make valid certain acts of Isaac Brower of Frederick county, as a justice of the

peace;

Ordered, That Messrs. Shriver, Lynch and Thomas of Fred-

erick, report the same.

Mr. McKaig submitted the following resolution:

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That resolution No. 6, passed at December session 1833, which provides for for furnishing editors of newspapers or public journals, at the expense of the State, with a copy of the daily printed journals of the Senate and House of Delegates, be and the same is hereby repealed.

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table.

Mr. Waters of Montgomery, submitted the following resolu-

tion:

Resolved, by the General Assembly of Maryland, That the committee on Claims, cause a diary to be kept, showing the number of days each member of the present legislature does attend, and that no member or clerk, be allowed any per diem, for any day that he is not in attendance, except prevented by indisposition in the city of Annapolis.

Which was read the first time, and ordered to lie on the table. The clerk of the Senate returned the bill, entitled an act, to allow further time to Stephen H. Gough of St. Mary's county, to

execute his bond for the year 1844;

Endorsed "will pass," and the bill ordered to be engrossed.
