

A bill entitled, an act relating to the issuing of executions, where plaintiffs are deceased :

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Yellott, Johnson and Thomas, of Talbot.

A bill entitled, a supplement to the act entitled, an act to incorporate the Mutual Fire Insurance Company, in Harford county, passed at December session, 1842.

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Yellott, Hopkins and Polk.

A bill entitled, an act for the benefit of Thomas Hook :

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Ecker, Powder and Stull.

A bill entitled, an act to regulate the appointment of steward or overseer of Cecil county alms house ;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Harris, Owen and Cropper.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Philip Pettibone, late collector of the second collection district of Anne Arundel county, to complete his collection of county taxes in said district ;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Murray, Thomas of Anne Arundel and Warfield.

A bill entitled, an act to authorise Henry M. Jamison, to bring a certain negro into Maryland ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Colored Population.

And a memorial from sundry citizens of the city of Baltimore, to exempt certain fish in pickle, from inspection in this State, when previously inspected elsewhere ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Inspections.

The bill entitled, an act to aid in raising a revenue to pay the interest on the State debt ;

And the resolution in favor of Jacob Charles ;

Were sent to the Senate.

The Speaker presented the memorial of Nathaniel Williams, praying for the passage of an act declaratory of the law concerning contempts of court ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Nail presented the petition of seventy-two citizens of Carroll, Frederick and Anne Arundel counties, praying a reduction of charges on the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road, for the transportation of limestone and other articles, intended for the improvement of the soil.

Mr. Poultney presented the memorial of sundry citizens of Baltimore county, praying for a change in the bounds of the third election district ;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. Poultney, Carroll, Welsh, Walker and Stansbury, of Baltimore county.
