Which was read and referred to Messrs. Kilgour, Griffith, Trundle and Waters, of Montgomery.

Mr. Lankford presented the petition of sundry citizens of Somerset county, remonstrating against the repeal of an act of Assembly therein mentioned ;

Which was read, and

On motion of Mr. Lankford,

Referred to the consideration of the Senate.

Mr. Smith presented the memorial of Thomas I. McKaig and William W. McKaig, praying compensation for professional services ;

Which was read.

Mr. Smith moved to refer said petition to the committee on Grievances and Courts of Justice.

Mr. Kilgour moved its reference to the committee on Claims ; Resolved in the affirmative.

Mr. Smith presented the memorial of Henry Thomas Weld, on behalf of the Maryland and New York Iron and Coal Company, praying to be protected in their rights to construct their rail road from their works on Jennings' Run, to the Baltimore and Ohio Rail Road Depot, in the town of Cumberland, and to the Chesapeake and Ohio Canal Basin, at or near said town ;

Which was read and referred to the committee on Internal Improvement.

Mr. Johnson presented the petition of sundry citizens of Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties, praying for the construction of a bridge over the Patuxent river near Snowden's Iron Works ;

Which was read and referred to the joint delegations from Anne Arundel and Prince George's counties.

Mr. McKaig presented the petition of the commissioners of the town of Frostburgh, praying an amendment to the act of incorporation of said town, so as to authorise a tax on dogs ;

Which was read and referred to Messrs. McKaig, Smith, Ham-mill and Fitzpatrick.

Mr. Weber presented the petition of Frederick Rohrer, John E. Crampton, and ninety other citizens of Washington county, praying the passage of a law, to prevent the sale of intoxicating drinks on the Sabbath day ;
